## Incredible Years Parents Programme

All of our teaching staff have, over the last three years, completed the Incredible Years teachers programme. The programme is designed to develop and encourage teachers capability to relate positively with the children in their care and to develop strategies that maximise the opportunity for children to relate well to others and to have a positive approach to school and to learning.

The Incredible Years people also run a free programme for parents that aims to help parents:

- Increase their children's social and emotional development.
- Gain skills to be a more confident parent.
- Learn ways to effectively change disruptive and stubborn behaviour.
- Fill their kete with tools to encourage positive behaviour.

Parents who have completed the course report that their children have gained in confidence, seem happier than before, are less aggressive and behave better – and we all want that for our children!
