





Kia ora from Miss Lawson!




Read: Find a book in your house that you want to read and read it to your parents/caregivers.

Draw a picture of your favourite part of the book and next to it, write why it is your favourite part.



Write: You are on a desert island and you can only take 2 people with you. Who would these 2 people be and why would you take them with you? Be descriptive! Don't forget to re-read your work so that it makes sense. Check for those capital letters and full stops!



Investigate this maths problem - remember there are lots of ways to solve it!

Miss Lawson is playing with her name and with numbers. She lets all the consonants (B C D F G H J K L M N P Q R S T V W X Y Z) equal 10 and all the vowels (A E I O U) equal 5. So the value of Miss Lawson's name is $10 + 5 + 10 + 10 + 10 + 5 + 10 + 10 + 5 + 10 = 85$. What is the value of your name?

Can you find at least 3 names that have a value of 30?

Miss Lawson's name has even and odd numbers. Her name goes even, odd, even, even, even, odd, even, even, odd, even.

Here are some more activities to complete if you are feeling up to the challenge!

What are some names that have an even, odd, even, odd, even, odd pattern?

What is the biggest value that a name of six letters can have?

What is the biggest value that you can actually find?



Spell: Here is your spelling list for this week—your goal is to be able to correctly spell each word by the end of the week and learn this spelling pattern. 'ow' 'ou'

found, how, now, round, loud, plough, cow, owl, count, row



Explore and investigate: Take time today for yourself. Find a quiet spot inside or outside your house. Sit down in a comfortable position and close your eyes when you are ready. Take 3, long, slow deep breaths in and out. Next, I want you to think of a setting (a place) which makes you feel happy. I want you to picture this place in your mind. Think about how it makes you feel, what you can see, what you can hear, what you can smell and maybe even what you can taste. Stay thinking for a few minutes before opening your eyes. Now see if you can draw this place that makes you feel happy. Add some colour if you like!
