1. Are spiders and insects the same?

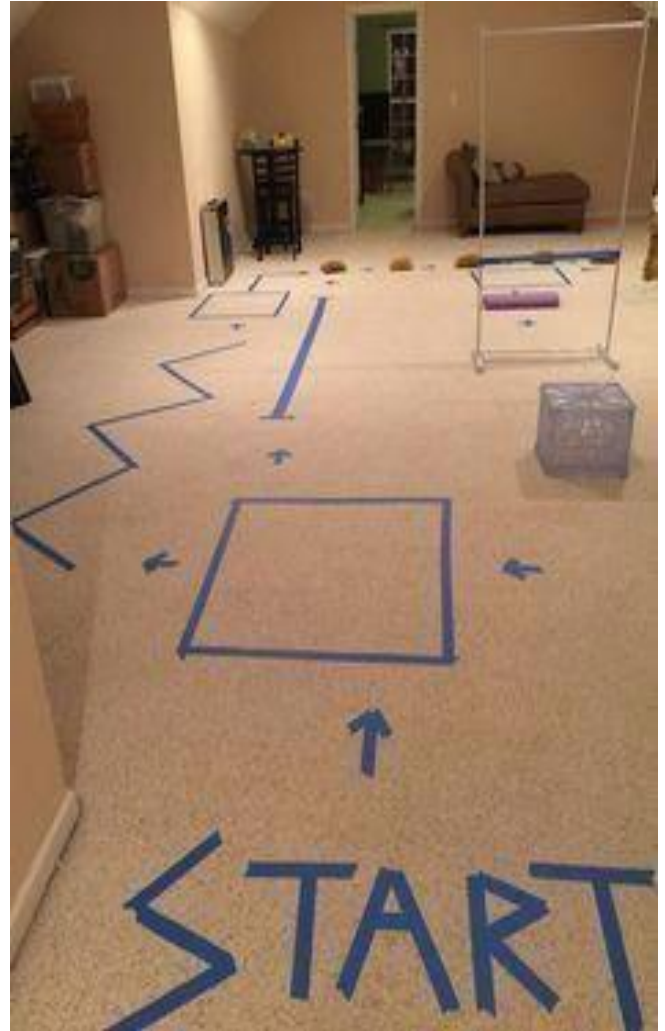

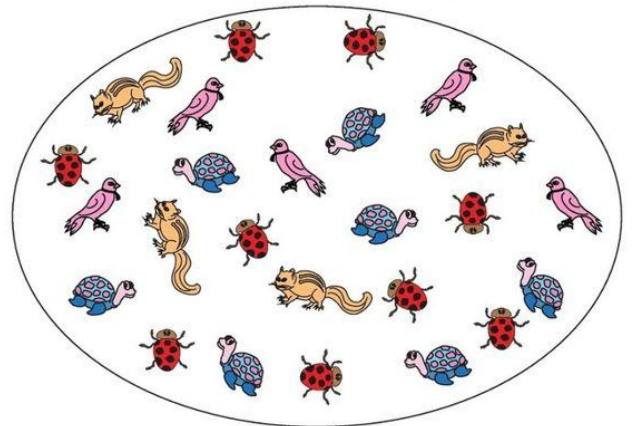
