After you have read the story try completing these activities.

- 1.) Make a nest with twigs, wool or paper or anything you can find.
- 2) Make 9 eggs to place inside.

For writing I would like you to write about what you have been doing in your bubble.



Title **My Bubble News**

Remember to write about **who** you are with, **what** you have been doing and **how** you felt about the activity. Start with a capital letter, use key words, leave spaces between your words, reread your writing to check it makes sense and put in a full stop at the end of a sentence.

Make a counting in 2's caterpillar with 10 circles for the body. Write the counting in 2's pattern, one number on each circle, on the caterpillar. Practise counting by 2's with your caterpillar, 2,4,6,8,10,12,14,16,18,20, forward and back.

**Can you solve these problems by counting in 2's?**

How many legs on 5 birds?      How many ears on 3 dogs?  
How many shoes in 2 pairs?

How many eyes on 4 people?  
How many ears on 6 rabbits?  
How many wheels on 8 bikes?

Our special **Letter of the Week** is the letter is **Nn**. Take time to look around your bubble and see what you can discover that starts with this letter. Collect the things that you find. Think of other things that start with the letter.



Draw pictures of these things and label them making sure you write the letter **n** correctly. You might like to try to write a sentence, or more about what you discover.

Choose 5 of these words that start with n to learn for your spelling this week;

**no, not, nut, Nan, nap, nun, nose, night, now, nine, nice, never, nest**



This week we are looking at our **sense of hearing** to discover more about your bubble. Find a place, sit down and close your eyes. After a while talk about and record, what you **hear**. What sounds are loud? What sounds are quiet? What sounds are near, which are far away? What sounds do you like, which do you not? Ask your helper if they can help you to make a telephone. Join 2 plastic cups together with a piece of string. Give 1 cup to your helper and pull the string tight, talk into the cups one at a time. Your helper will hear your voice through the cup at the other end.

Or make some musical instruments like drums, whistles, or shakers and put on a family concert!
