Warm up: Can you name the value of each of the New Zealand coins and notes?

Practise counting in 2's, 5's, and 10's. Then try counting in 20's, 50's and 100's.



Descriptive Writing - Find a plant, tree or flower around you and describe it to me.

Remember to:

- Write the name of the plant/tree/flower? Describe what it looks like?
 Write at least 4 sentences Include 3 adjectives.



Here is your spelling list:

Turtles & Seahorse Groups: all, are, back, be, after, about, as, because, came, day

Dolphins & Starfish Groups: /ow/ sound -

Rainbow, window, arow, show, know, grow, own, howlow, owl, yellow

Practise writing the word, covering it, and then spelling it out loud.



Art - Rubbings - Place a piece of paper over an object and gently rub over the paper with a lead pencil, coloured pencil or crayon.

Leaf rubbings - Go for a walk in your backyard and find some different leaves. Make sure they are dry. Look carefully at all the details on the leaf. Can you think of some adjectives to describe the patterns and details?

Coin rubbings - If you have some coins at home try doing a coin rubbing. Watch the image on the coin appear! Don't forget the back of the coin too.
