Hello,

Everyone connected with Kaeo School will know how much we value regular attendance at school. Simply, if children are absent from school then we can not do our jobs, indeed the large majority of our children that require extra assistance at Kaeo School are those that have poor attendance.

It is recognised that the last two years of the pandemic have affected attendance and that we are, as a country, prioritising our health and wellbeing somewhat over learning but attendance remains important and everyone should be doing their best to ensure that children attend school as much as possible.

Covid will be with us for a while yet and there is no cut off date for when we will be free of it. Therefore, keeping children away from school until the risk of contracting Covid is gone could see them isolating at home for a long time – clearly this is not a logical or sensible approach.

What is sensible is what we all have been doing. Sending children to school when they are well. Keeping children at home when they test positive for Covid 19 and for the required 7 days when they are household contacts. Keeping children home when they are unwell for reasons other than Covid 19, maintaining a close focus on personal hygiene. Getting them (and yourselves) vaccinated will also help to minimise the risks of catching Covid.

Additionally, it is important too that children have the structure and routine that school provides, that they see their friends and teachers (and principal!) and that even in these strange times that 'normal life' continues as much as it can.
