Kia ora Te Whanau,

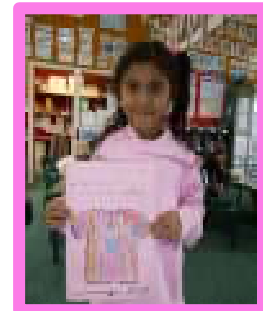
