Hello everyone,

School attendance is in the news again today with Associate Education Minister David Seymour signalling that he wishes to introduce fines and penalties for parents whose children are unjustifiably absent from school.

In an article in the New Zealand Herald Mr Seymour is quoted as saying:

"We will be signalling, as the PM has, that is it a duty to send your kids to school. And we will be investigating whether we should actually start using the power to fine, as they have in the UK, more frequently."

And the article noted that:

Currently, parents can be fined if their child is repeatedly absent from school ... The fines are up to \$300 for a first successful prosecution and up to \$3000 for subsequent prosecutions.

No one associated with Kaeo School for any length of time will be uncertain about how important we view regular attendance at school but we understand that what appears to some to be a black and white issue is often more complex than it first seems. That is why we work hard to encourage attendance and to support families overcome any difficulties that they may have getting children to school.

We have great pride that our school's attendance levels exceed those of other schools similar to ours (thanks everyone) but we should of course not become complacent and everyone one should make a strong commitment to ensure that their child attends school unless there is a legitimate reason not to - such as being sick, attending tangi, or a family emergency.

Let's keep leading the way attendance wise- and if we can help in any way please let us know.
