## School buses to Rugby Practice.

Frank Stewart has been in touch to advise that children are using the Wainui/Whangaroa buses to travel to rugby practice at the Kaeo Rugby Club. He is concerned that the buses are becoming overcrowded on practice days and that are becoming unsafe.

In addition, school buses are not generally to be used by children other than to transport them from home to school and from school to their home each day. Frank has kindly been flexible about this when the numbers are small and when it occurs as a one off (e.g. when children might travel to a friend's house for a special occasion).
